Why should I consider an associate degree in Nursing?

There is an ever-increasing demand for nurses and others in the health science fields. Ancilla College offers a registered nursing program, the ASN – Associate of Science Degree in Nursing. The Nursing program seeks to provide the student with the knowledge and skills necessary to provide direct care to a variety of individuals consistent with the health care needs of the people in the communities they serve. Students enrolled in the nursing program will have good clinical experience at various area hospitals in Plymouth, Knox, South Bend, Rochester, and elsewhere.

The Health Sciences track is recommended for admissions consideration to the nursing program or other science majors. The program includes prerequisite and required classes for nursing and other science majors. Successful completion of the prerequisite classes will positively influence the opportunity to be admitted into the Nursing Program.

What can I do with an associate degree in Nursing?

The Nursing program (ASN) at Ancilla College will prepare you to take the NCLEX licensure exam for licensure as an RN in the State of Indiana. Students achieving an ASN often continue on to receive a bachelor's (BSN) or master's (MSN) for more career advancement opportunities. The ASN program will also prepare you to transfer to a four-year institution to further your studies.
