

Tips on Matching Questions

- Sometimes answers are only used once. Sometimes answers can be used more than once. Make sure you comprehend the directions.
- Start from the column with the longest sentence phrases. It makes finding answers quicker. You are only looking at the long phrases once and looking at the word(s) choices more than once.
- Start with the ones you know for sure. You can use process of elimination for the remaining.
- Review your answers. The ones you know 100% sure of mark with a darker line. The ones you don't know for sure, write in lighter pencil.
- For those you are not sure of, look for clues and/or relationships in the question.
- Questions can come from multiple sources such as the textbook, lectures, and readings. Reflect back on these if you are unsure of the answer.
- If unsure of an answer, it is probably the one you have not used.
